Letters from our Village Churches

After 27 years serving you all and our Group of Churches in Abington Pigotts, Guilden Morden, Litlington, Steeple Morden, Tadlow, and Wendy, it's going be strange not having Canon Shamus Williams here with us anymore. He most definitely will be hugely missed, and leaves behind a Shamus-sized gap in our villages. I'm also sure, like me, you wish him the very best in his retirement which, after so long, is so thoroughly deserved.

We are therefore now in "vacancy", what used to be called "an interregnum" - which means we don't have an incumbent or Priest-incharge in our Church Group.

During this time, we are asked to reflect on what direction we want to take our churches moving forward: how we want to do things in future; how we can be involved in our community; how we can realise God's love in our actions as "the local church".

This is also a time for Ely Diocese and our local Shingay Deanery to consider how we are to be configured as a Church Group in the future. Whatever they decide, right now we have an opportunity to explore our God-given gifts and our preparedness to use them.

We hope to be able to continue with Sunday Services as usual however with fewer of us, times may vary so please check each week. There may also be times when the type of service you are used to has changed depending on who is available on the day or whether we have managed to find a visiting priest to help. Other activities run by church members can be expected to continue as usual.

I will continue to offer what I can in the time available. You may or may not know that I work full-time at Addenbrooke's Hospital. My day in the parishes will continue to be every Tuesday. I will be leading Morning Prayer (a 20-minute service) most Tuesday mornings at 10:00am in St Catherine's Church, Litlington. Check on the Services pages for dates. Everyone and anyone are welcome to join me. I will remain in the church until at least 11:00am, so if you fancy a tea/coffee and chat, then come

along. I don't live in the Group villages, so am less likely to know about those needing a pastoral visit or Home Communion. If either is wanted, please leave me a phone message or drop me an email (see details in front of this magazine) and I will get back to you. Again, planned visits will generally need to be on Tuesdays.

I hope to continue to offer baptisms (christenings) and weddings, but my weekend availability may limit possible dates. Please be aware that baptisms may need to be held as part of the regular Sunday Services. We can discuss your requirements when you contact me.

Funeral Services can continue in our churches but will probably need to be taken by a Licensed Lay Minister or visiting Priest. The Funeral Director will help you with this.

Please, get in touch with me by email or phone if you have any queries. I will get back to you. If it's urgent, email me and mark as "urgent". I will call you back as quickly as I can.

I pray for God's blessings and guidance as we move forward into this next chapter for our villages and churches.

In the Garden

My gardening column in June was so well received (by at least two people from Steeple Morden) that Yasmeen has again entrusted the task to me. Apologies to those who prefer her more expert advice.

What a summer! No one surely can doubt that something strange is happening to our climate. Ten years ago I was a climate sceptic, unconvinced that anything dramatic was going to happen. When the Cambridge Botanic Garden planted a 'dry' garden to test what could survive were temperatures to increase, I was cynical as we were enduring occasional summers that were damp or cold.

Yet here we are, with eight of the hottest days on record taking place in that brief period. As you drive around the villages of Cambridgeshire and Bedfordshire, you are confronted by the sight of numerous fields blackened by fire. And there are increasing numbers of dead trees in the hedgerows. But what does this mean for the gardener?

This summer, we've seen runner bean flowers burnt by the sun, so that the crop from a row of hitherto healthy bean poles has been decimated; only a very few have produced anything edible. Nasturtiums, too, have simply been destroyed. Tomatoes in the green house whose leaves touched the glass have been shrivelled. Courgette and pumpkin plants have behaved abnormally; pumpkins have ripened prematurely and very small, and the courgettes simply haven't grown for lack of water. One can only imagine the effect this has had on farmers dependent on crops which follow flowers.

There have been successes; aubergines, chillies and tomatoes have loved the hot weather, as have cucumbers and sweet corn, crops normally associated with warmer climes. The mild weather in the spring meant that apple, cherry and plum blossom avoided any frost and have set more fruit than usual, although some of the trees look unhappy for lack of hydration and the fruits might be smaller than usual. We are finding cannas and ginger lilies surviving the winter without additional protection. It is easy to see how, both in this country and across the world, an increase in temperature will affect both fruit and flower production.

How do we as gardeners deal with this? Inspired by the Cambridge experiment and by Beth Chatto's dry gravel garden in Essex, Yasmeen

In the Garden (cont.) Dominic Brigstocke

has planted a border on the south east side of the house entirely of plants adapted to dry conditions. With either thick, leathery leaves or thin tough ones, these can withstand the high temperatures without becoming dehydrated. And throughout this summer they have grown strongly with little attention and additional water. So, unless there's a remarkable reversal in what seems to be a permanent increase in temperature, we're going to have to adapt what we grow or learn to protect our plants in new ways. Previously traditional British crops like beans and apples may become difficult to grow without shade, but it might become easier to grow exotic crops such as peaches, lemons and apricots.

So, I'm no longer a climate sceptic, and no one seeing pictures of the shrinking Arctic ice can doubt that we're in the middle of a sudden change in climate. We can all do our best to reduce our contribution to anything which is fuelling change, but as gardeners it looks as if we're also going to have to quickly learn new methods and grow plants better adapted to periods of extremely hot dry weather.

We are particularly looking for someone with skills and experience in:






