Rector's Letter

Shamus Williams

At the time of writing, Covid rates locally remain high. For this reason, at churches where carol services have packed out congregations (Abington Pigotts, Litlington and Steeple Morden), it seems wise to me to see how things look in December. If things don't look too good, possibly we will try to hold these outside at an earlier time of day. Singing is one of the most hazardous things in terms of virus transmission, so singing carols inside is not necessarily going to be a good idea.

On a happier note, nothing is going to prevent us celebrating the true meaning of Christmas, carol services or no carol services.

Christmas now seems to be on two levels: the commercial, religiously meaningless winter festival detached from the story of the birth of Jesus, and the infinitely deeper, life-giving real meaning of Christmas. I know which I prefer. It's a bit like the old Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas", said by some to have been written in a sort of code at a time when Catholics were persecuted and had to be very careful what they said about faith.

"On the First day of Christmas my true love gave to me, a partridge in a pear tree," symbolising God (true love) and Jesus Christ (the partridge).

Second day: Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.

Seventh day: Swans a-swimming were the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Eighth day: Maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

Tenth day: Lords a-leaping represent the 10 Commandments.

Eleventh day: Pipers piping were the 11 faithful apostles.

Twelfth day: Twelve drummers drumming represented the points of the Apostles Creed.



In the Garden

Yasmeen Brigstocke

Last month I made some suggestions for suitable trees to grow for the "Queen's Green Canopy - Plant a tree for the Jubilee". So, I thought it might be useful to write about how to incorporate trees into a garden scheme. It's a good idea when planting trees to think about what to plant with them, though some look perfect on their own as a focal point, just surrounded by lawn or a wildflower meadow. But such a tree needs to be something special and provide interest throughout the year to earn this prominent place. I hesitate to suggest a silver birch because they are almost too popular, yet varieties such as *Betula utilis var. jacquemontii* 'Grayswood Ghost', which has one of the whitest stems, looks too amazing not to mention.

I like to underplant trees with bulbs such as snowdrops, winter aconites or wood anemones because they add interest, without being labour intensive. They can be planted as random clumps or in a distinct circle surrounding the tree, forming a beautiful carpet of colour to cheer up a grey spring day. And they will come up year after year and increase in numbers if they like the soil conditions. The bulbs need not only be those that flower in the early months of the year. *Crocus sativus*, cyclamen and colchicums are all fascinating autumn flowering bulbs that will liven up the otherwise difficult to manage spot underneath a tree, especially at a time when many herbaceous plants are dying down. Crocus sativus is the saffron crocus, whose bright red stigmas (three pointed strands which poke out from the middle of the pale lilac flower) can be collected, dried and used in cooking. It's a favourite spice in Middle Eastern food. But be careful not to confuse them with colchicums though, as the latter are poisonous.

Alliums are good companion plants for apple trees because they ward off pests and diseases such as wood borers and scab. This family of bulbs includes chives, leeks, garlic, ransomes, as well as the ornamental Dutch alliums – *Allium hollandicum*. 'Purple Sensation', *Allium 'cristophii'* and *Allium sphaerocephalon*. Growing bulbs in the grass around trees also weakens the competitive nature of grass, making it easier for a young tree to take hold.

The use of neatly clipped evergreen shrubs can complement the shape of a deciduous tree such as a flowering cherry, especially in winter.

Box or Euonymus japonica make good geometric shapes, such as spheres or cubes, and tolerate the low light levels under the tree canopy in the summer.

Trees can also be used as supports for climbers, especially in an informal woodland situation. A climbing rose or clematis trained into the midst of a tree such as a magnolia can extend its attractiveness through the summer; the beautiful display of magnolia flowers will have finished by the time the climbers begin to flower. Be careful not to choose a very vigorous variety of clematis or rose to avoid swamping their host. And plant the climbers away from the stem of the tree to avoid too much competition.

Lastly, you could consider planting a Christmas tree to decorate outside, year after year!
