Associate Priest's Letter

Ann Bol

Summer is here at last. Lots of rain and cold followed by hot days and humidity - weather that some of us love while others hate it. This is also the time when the wild flowers flourish. A wildflower is defined as "a flower of an uncultivated variety or one that grows freely without human intervention." Over the years, we have learned to value these independent beauties: by letting road edges grow tall and wild; by following the "no-mow May rule"; and by encouraging "wild corners" in our gardens.

I was surprised to discover that we are blessed with having wildflowers flowering all year round: different colours, shapes, sizes, preferred habitats. Some we are all familiar with (ox-eye daisy, dandelion, poppy) and others less-so (pasqueflower, grass of Parnassus). Popping up throughout the year, these plants provide a year-round source of food for insects and wild life, together with a pleasing vista for the human eye.

We have four seasons in the church year too - Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter - the first two separated from the latter two by periods of Ordinary Time. Like the wild flowers that appear throughout the year, there are various commemorations, festivals and saint's days. Again, there are some with which we are familiar (Harvest, Halloween, St George's Day, St Patrick's Day) and others that may be less familiar to us. Each is associated with a specific colour bringing dashes of colour into the church building as fabrics are changed to match the day.

Some examples coming up over July and August:

July 22 - Mary Magdalene, colour white;

July 3 - Thomas the Apostle, colour red;

July 27 - Bishop Westcott, teacher (after which Westcott House, Cambridge is named), colour green;

August 6 - Transfiguration of Jesus, colour gold.

Dotted throughout the year, these days provide us with reminders of those who have gone before us in faith; that their examples can feed and encourage us to follow in their footsteps; and that by using ordinary people, through the Holy Spirit, God continues to work towards making this a better place for all his creation.

With this in mind, four times a year we come across the Ember Days: days dedicated to prayer and fasting, especially for those called to serve and dedicate their lives to God. The Petertide Ember Days fall at the end of June. These days are marked as the time when Ordinations

and Priestings take place. This year these services will be held in the Ely Diocese on July 3 & 4. We hold all involved in our prayers.

In the Garden

Here we are already, it's the middle of summer. The first flush of roses is over, and the fresh, heady greens of spring have given way to colours of mature sobriety. Purple leaves hang heavy on beech and cherry. The sun dries the earth and watering becomes a bit of a chore.

I'm keeping a watchful eye on the trees in the garden; in the past few years the hot summers have killed off two beautiful specimens in the garden, in an unexpected way. The first was a hazel which suddenly lost its leaves in August and then, last summer, the strawberry tree began to look stressed, dropping its leathery deep green leaves. Thinking that the willow nearby was taking up too much water we gave it a hard prune, removing all its branches. But all that happened was that it exposed the strawberry tree to the scorching August sun and almost overnight its remaining leaves turned brown and the whole thing died. I keep saying to myself, it shouldn't have happened, but this, I guess, is the problem that climate change brings. So, be vigilant of trees and shrubs in your domain this summer, and, in case they start to show signs of stress, be careful not to make things worse for them.

Looking back on it now, I should have cleared all the weeds around the tree and watered it deeply by sticking a tube down to a depth of at least 50cms in the earth, a bit like a canula, to direct the life-giving water straight down to its deeper roots.

Anyway, back to this year. If you're growing garlic, mid-July is the time to harvest it. Its leaves will be starting to wither away now so the bulbs can be dug up and left to dry in a sheltered area away from rain. Save a couple of the biggest ones to separate into cloves and plant in September for next year's crop.

The flower borders may be looking a bit tired and dry so it will do no harm to mulch them well after a good watering. The mulch will retain the moisture in the ground for longer. It will also make weeding easier. And roses which repeat flower in early autumn will do much better after having their leaves sprayed weekly with a foliar feed of seaweed extract.

Vegetable plants with are nourished with some organic liquid fertiliser will reward you with producing better crops. And if slugs and snails have lunched on your beans, lettuces and spinach, there's still time to plant some more. They will be safer if you sow them in 9cm pots filled

with compost and allow them to produce at least five or six leaves before planting them into the border. So long as the beans' growing tip remains intact the plants will continue to climb skywards.

As usual, we have to plan ahead and now is the time to think about what to grow for winter and the following spring. Young plants of winter vegetables such as cabbages, broccoli and kale need to be planted out now. There is still time to grow herbs such as coriander, dill and basil from seed for use in the autumn.

Maybe you're like me, and will spend the summer propagating new plants from cuttings and trying to catch up with the weeding and pruning, but hopefully you'll have time to take in the beauty of the plants and wildlife that surrounds us from the comfort of a sun lounger with a cold drink in hand. Enjoy!


