# In the Garden

# Dominic Brigstocke

Yasmeen has been writing this column for eight years now and I thought it would be good for her to have a month off. So this is an amateur gardener's musings – you won't find any Latin names here! But you will find a few tips from a lazy gardener who prefers little effort for maximum result.

People often say to me that they've tried planting seeds but nothing came up. I've been wondering about this and thought I could share the few tricks I've picked up in thirty years of gardening.

Slugs and snails are a real menace; they eat all the most tender plants and leave nothing for us. But rather than pour poison on the ground, there are ways to get round the problem. I find that beans, peas, spinach and lettuces planted in the ground are eaten as soon as they poke their heads above ground. So now I plant them in modules or pots and keep them until they are big and strong enough to fend for themselves. But even mature French beans are vulnerable, so I've taken to growing the climbing variety and training them up bamboo sticks; once about a foot up the pole, they're safe and will crop well.

Carrots can also be difficult to grow. Forget planting them before April, it's too cold, wait until May and, rather than planting them in the ground where it can get dry or there's loads of competition from weeds, try planting carrots in a window box type planter filled with compost, about four feet long and nine inches deep. Plant two rows, one down each side. I've found this to be very successful and it's easy to tidy if the occasional weed seed falls in. Parsnips can have similar treatment, but their roots are longer so a deeper raised bed is a more suitable place to plant them.

In fact, I love gardening in a raised bed. We bought a couple from a garden centre about five years ago. Apart from the fact that you are working at waist height and don't need to bend, the limited space means there's little to weed and they're easy to water. Filled with compost, they're a perfect place to raise smaller vegetables like lettuces, radishes, carrots, French beans. Being three feet up means they're bothered less by pests and if the odd snail does manage to creep up the legs, they're easy to spot.

My absolute favourite plants to grow are tomatoes and potatoes, both solanums (sorry, there's a Latin word), because nothing will eat them (their leaves are very poisonous). The principal appeal of these two is that they usually produce heavy crops with little effort. Potatoes go in the ground around mid March, when little else is happening in the garden

and, apart from protection if it gets very cold, they will produce lots of lovely vegetables by July. It is advisable to earth them up, that is to draw soil up around their stems to encourage better crops but, my experience is that, even if you don't bother, there will still be a reasonable number of spuds. Tomatoes can be started on a windowsill as early as January or February and grown inside until it's warm enough to plant them out in the garden in mid May. They will do best in a greenhouse, but there are some varieties which will manage well outside if it's a good summer.

And my favourite vegetable of all? Garlic. It seems to grow well around here. In early October, you can plant individual cloves of garlic bought from the supermarket about three inches deep. Within a few weeks a sharp, pointed stem will push up through the ground and they will then stand through the whole winter, however harsh. Come the following July, when the greenery dies down, you dig up whole new bulbs of garlic. Effortless. My kind of gardening!


