Rector's Letter

Shamus Williams

At this stressful and testing time for all of us, I am sure that like me you are thinking of all the essential workers, not least of course those who are caring for the sick. One of the many groups of essential workers I feel very grateful for are all the postal and delivery people. I am writing just following the very limiting loosening of the conditions allowing people to leave their homes, but I am very conscious of the categories of people who are still unable to leave their homes at all. This made me think that there may be things to learn from the experts in isolation in the monastic tradition, or to use one of my favourite words, those who live the "eremitic" life. Most of us are eremitic these days.

One of the greatest and most well-known of the Desert Fathers is St. Anthony. Some of his sayings can be found in a document called the Apophthegmata. Here are a few: Someone asked Anthony, "What must one do in order to please God?" The old man replied, "Pay attention to what I tell you: whoever you may be, always have God before your eyes, whatever you do, do it according to the testimony of the holy Scriptures; in whatever place you live, do not easily leave it. Keep these three precepts and you will be saved." Anthony said, "I saw the snares that the enemy spreads out over the world and I said groaning, "What can get through from such snares?" Then I heard a voice saying to me, 'Humility." A brother said to Anthony, "Pray for me." The old man said to him, " I will have no mercy upon you, nor will God have any, if you yourself do not make an effort and if you do not pray to God. Anthony said, "Whoever hammers a lump of iron, first decides what he is going to make of it, a scythe, a sword, or an axe. Even so we ought to make up our minds what kind of virtue we want to forge or we labour in vain."

These sayings may be 1700 years old, but I find them helpful at this strange time having to be at home so much.

Donating to the Churches

In last month's "Prospect", there was an appeal for funds for Steeple Morden Church. A big thank you to all those who sent donations in for their Gift Day/Spring Fair.

We are very conscious at this time that there are many individuals and families who are struggling financially, with reduced income through jobs furloughed, or redundancies, as well as small and large businesses going under. We want therefore to be as sensitive as we can in asking for your financial contributions. As you may imagine, the giving for each church is heavily affected by not being able to receive cash collections at services in church. If you **are able** to help by setting up a standing order and/or keeping aside donations in cash to give at a later date, this would be a huge help.

Every parish in the Church of England is expected to contribute towards the costs of ministry. These include paying the stipends of stipendiary clergy and the costs of housing them, as well as national costs such as training ordinands. These contributions by parishes do not contribute to the costs of bishops or cathedrals as they are paid for separately by The Church Commissioners. In addition, there are local costs for every parish. Here in The Shingay Group of Parishes, this includes maintaining our historic church buildings. Just paying for basic insurance cover for these costs many thousands of pounds each year. Repairs to historic buildings are very expensive. At the moment we are unable to raise funds through activities such as concerts or Fetes.

In the Garden

The longest day is fast approaching, and I am so grateful for the bright evenings and the sunny days enabling us to sit out in the garden. It is interesting to see how plants have been responding to the weather. Light, temperature and humidity are the three key elements that determine how well a plant grows and whilst there has been plenty of sunshine, we have not had much rain. Without copious watering, seeds will be struggling to germinate in the dry soil. So, it is important to provide enough water after sowing seeds or bedding out young plants. Raised beds tend to dry out more quickly than expansive borders and will benefit from a thick layer of mulch to retain the moisture and deter weeds. I prefer to use shredded woody material, but grass clippings will be fine if kept away from the growing vegetables.

It's best to water borders and raised beds early in the morning for a number of reasons. Firstly, it stops plants from wilting as the sun comes up and dries out the soil. It also creates a humid atmosphere around them, which keeps the temperature from becoming too high in the strong sunlight. (Plants grow best around 18 -25 degrees) Watering in the morning means that by sunset the soil will be dry again, making it harder for slugs and snails to move around and forage on your plants. After a very cold or frosty night, spraying plant leaves, before the sun's rays fall on them, will help to reduce the damage caused by the low temperatures.

So that's the theory, but in practice I have rarely manage to water my garden before midday and as a result the potato plants we've been growing were scorched by the cold nights we experienced in early May. My husband reassures me that they will recover whilst I mutter about wishing I had put fleece over them.

Tender vegetables grown under cover, such as runner beans, courgettes, pumpkins and tomatoes can be planted out in raised beds or borders now that night time temperatures are higher, and the chance of a frosty night is pretty slim. However, it is important to acclimatise them slowly. This can be done either by transferring them from the windowsill or greenhouse to a cold frame or by planting them under a cloche or polytunnel. To begin with, keep them covered all the time and then start removing the covering during daylight hours and putting it back in the evening for several days until they become used to being outdoors. This also applies to half hardy bedding plants such as cosmos and petunias. It's not too late to sow spinach, runner and French beans, kohl rabi and herbs, but all of these will need to be watered every day unless we have rain. Lettuce seeds will not germinate if the temperature is higher than 25 degrees at any point during a day or two after sowing, so chose a cool spell to sow the seeds and use cold water. This year I am sowing courgette and pumpkin direct into the ground to see what the difference is between them and the ones I started off in pots indoors.

I am also sowing vegetables such as carrots, beetroot and parsnips, broccoli and cabbage for a good supply during the autumn and winter as I am unsure whether we will have some sort of lockdown again as the weather gets colder.

Finally, I would like to say a big thank you to all the farmers and horticulturists who grow the food we eat. We are so used to taking it for granted that there will always be fresh fruit and vegetables in the supermarkets. Growing them myself has certainly taught me that it is not an easy task to produce food which is available every day of the year.
