As I write, the first tentative signs of Spring can be detected, with just a little bit of greenery appearing on some trees and bushes. The birds sound like they are upping the volume in the early mornings. Soon, they will be waking us all up with full throttled chirps.

This time of year reminds me of a walk I did with others a long time ago when at theological college. I recently returned there briefly, hence the cover photo this month. The walk was in the company of a student who had previously been a lecturer in botany. We were amazed at his deep knowledge of plants, birds and insects. He stopped us, as in the very far distance he spotted some birds. We could barely see them, but he knew at once they were red kites, which were relatively rare in those days. We had binoculars, and sure enough he was right. At many of the roadside and field side bushes, we stopped as he identified for us all the plants, and identified the eggs of insects on leaves. At his house, he had a beautiful cabinet of shells, which I think was Victorian, inherited from an ancestor. Knowledge of the natural world appeared to run in the family. As someone not very good at distinguishing plants and insects, I greatly admire those who have studied these things.

Nothing is so beautiful as Spring –

When weeds, in wheels, shoot long and lovely and lush;
Thrush's eggs look little low heavens, and thrush
Through the echoing timber does so rinse and wring
The ear, it strikes like lightnings to hear him sing;
The glassy peartree leaves and blooms, they brush
The descending blue; that blue is all in a rush
With richness; the racing lambs too have fair their fling.
What is all this juice and all this joy?
A strain of the earth's sweet being in the beginning
In Eden garden. – Have, get, before it cloy,
Before it cloud, Christ, lord, and sour with sinning,
Innocent mind and Mayday in girl and boy,
Most, O maid's child, thy choice and worthy the winning.

Environmental issues linked to climate change dominate the news and the question of how one gardens sustainably has become important.

“We are now painfully aware that we face a climate and biodiversity crisis, and that every effort counts.”

Keith Weed, Royal Horticultural Society President.

I am guessing that he means that every one of us can do something towards a more sustainable way of gardening, so that the sum total of our efforts will make a difference. And this is likely, as the Wildlife Trust mention that, in England, private gardens in total occupy over 10 million acres, more than all the nature reserves put together. So, we each have a part to play in slowing down climate change and increasing biodiversity.

Biodiversity is the variety of life on earth, from the tiniest bacteria, plants and animals to a whole ecosystem. The greater the variety there is, the bigger the chance of stability and survival from extinction.

The earth is warming up, causing climate change, and it is most likely due to too much CO₂ being produced by our lifestyles. We need to think of ways to reduce this by changing the way we do things, including how we garden and what we expect of it. We may have to come to terms with the fact that a large immaculate lawn, weed free borders, pest free plants and moss free paths are simply unsustainable because they don't encourage biodiversity, and to produce such a garden requires products such as petrol, weed killer and insecticides which increase CO₂ emissions.

Reducing the use of petrol driven machinery will cut CO₂ output. But a return to using hand tools may not be practical in a large garden. So instead, designing it to minimise the use of petrol-driven lawn mowers and hedge cutters might be possible. Turning areas of lawn into wildflower meadows and planting shrubs which do not need regular trimming will certainly help. And does one really need a leaf blower when a rake will do the job just as well, and far more quietly?

The production of bedding plants, the petunias, lobelias, geraniums and other half hardy plants we love to use in hanging baskets and other containers, invariably use a lot of energy. Such plants require more heat

and light than seeds sown straight into the open ground. Unless they are grown at the garden centre where we buy them, the additional cost of transporting them to the place of sale will also create carbon dioxide. One alternative is to buy them from a local grower, the other is to sow the seeds ourselves. These half-hardy plants are surprisingly easy to grow from seed indoors on a warm windowsill. March is the perfect time to start them off. Hardy plants which require no heat could be used instead. Trailing nasturtiums, stock, sweet peas, shrubs such as lavender or hardy fuchsias can be substituted for containers.

Reducing the need for plastic will also greatly help the environment. Nowadays, plants are increasingly sold in grey plastic pots which can be recognised by recycling machines, unlike the black ones. Plastic pots which cannot be recycled can always be re-used after washing. It might be worth finding out if local gardening clubs or horticultural groups can make use of them.

Perhaps it is time to question our usual habits and see if there are better, more sustainable ways of growing and enjoying our gardens.

PATIENTS' FRAGMENTED MEMORIES INSPIRES PHIL'S BOOK

A hospital chaplain and former curate in the Shingay Group who spent hours chatting to patients with dementia was so moved - he turned their memories into poetry.

The Rev Phil Sharkey, of Cambridge's Addenbrooke's and Rosie Hospitals, listened intently to the fragmented recollections of 30 patients, and crafted key words into verses they might like to have written.

And when Covid struck, Phil found himself at home and working via Zoom and telephone, he returned to each poem and wrote in poetic reply, to show Addenbrookes core values of "Safe, Kind and Excellent". These replies to the patients feature in the book as "reflections" of the original poems and reassure the patient that they are listened to.

Now the collection, the result of a poetry and spirituality initiative funded by the Royal Voluntary Service, has been turned into a book called 'Words to Remember – Poems Lost and Found'.

It was launched on National Poetry Day (7 Oct) and has been found to be of especial interest to the caring professions and people who live with loved ones with dementia. It is now being used for teaching in Addenbrooke's and it is hoped a course can be developed to share the learning across Chaplaincy nationally.

'Words to Remember – Poems Lost and Found' is published in-house by Cambridge University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and is available in ring-bound paperback priced £10 by following this link: - <https://shop.act4addenbrookes.org.uk/collections/books/products/words-to-remember>

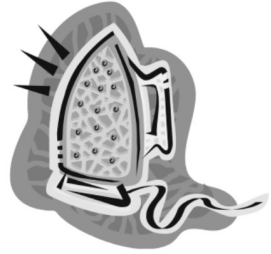



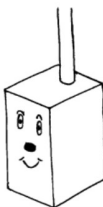
