Rector's Letter

Shamus Williams

At our services during much of May, we will hear some of the stories of how Christ appeared to various people after His resurrection. A notable feature of most of these accounts is how Jesus repeatedly greets people with "Peace be with you". Doubtless He said this to many people before He was crucified, but He seems to stress this all the more after the resurrection. Hearing this phrase repeated many times in church during May is likely to have an extra resonance this year, as we continue to think and pray for an end to violence in Ukraine. The accounts of the polar opposite of peace there have been shocking. In total contrast to the violence, it has been heartening to hear of the many thousands of people of compassion and goodwill who have offered a shelter and home for the refugees, both here and in the countries surrounding Ukraine.

Just one practical helper I read about was Adam Krasiński, a 22-year-old student from Warsaw, who got together with two friends and drove a convoy of three cars to the Ukranian border. "It's what we could do to help," he said. "We don't have the money to help but we do have cars and we can drive." They took a family of six Ukrainians, four Moroccan students and an Afghan back to Warsaw. "The volume of people fleeing is quite incredible, and the way Poland is reacting is quite emotional," he said. "Everyone who can is helping."

The cover picture this month is of a Bible and someone praying. Whether we are in a position to offer practical help or not, these are two things which can also help. Of course we pray for peace, and pray for all who are suffering, but our prayer also can help us to keep our compassion flowing, and not allow the accounts of brutal violence in any way to brutalise us. And a good prayer might be slowly to repeat and meditate upon that greeting of the risen Lord: "Peace be with you. My peace I give to you".

In the Garden

There is something very satisfying about growing flowers to decorate your own home or to give to family or friends. April is a good time to start a hardy annual cutting patch to grow flowers such as scabious, cornflowers, nigella and calendula. Hardy annuals are fast growing plants which grow from seed and flower in the same year and they are robust enough to withstand late frosty nights. They are also fairly easy to grow.

Ideally, the area you chose should get several hours of sun a day and doesn't have overhanging trees or shrubs. A four metre by two metre plot will provide you with enough flowers to fill a vase every few days through the summer. You can simply dig out this area or create a couple of raised beds. The important thing is to break down the surface soil to a very fine texture so that the seeds can put down roots easily. Dig the bed over with a spade and fork breaking up any large clods of earth and removing weeds, including their roots. Then rake it, getting rid of small stones. You can add general purpose fertiliser, but this is not usually needed unless your soil looks very poor. This is because most hardy annuals don't need the rich soil required by other plants such as dahlias and roses. In fact, you might find that, in a very fertile soil which has plenty of nitrates, they are very leafy and don't produce as many flowers.

I then make little furrows about a centimetre deep, in lines about 10-15 centimetres apart and carefully water them to ensure the soil is wet. This gives you defined lines to sow the seeds in. Then anything coming up between these rows is likely to be a weed. Sow the seeds, with the tallest varieties at the back of the border and shorter varieties at the front. Sprinkle the seeds sparingly along the lines. Finish by carefully pulling the soil over the furrows to cover them, firming it down lightly with the back of a rake.

It's important to set up some sort of animal deterrent system to stop cats, birds etc. from spoiling the area. I use a number of small sticks placed around the edges of the bed about 30 centimetres apart and form a sort of web of string criss-crossing the area tied around the sticks. You could also try chicken wire, raised above the ground by about 10 centimetres.

Keep the area moist without disturbing the soil too much, so a fine spray-head hose or watering can is pretty useful for this. Seedlings should

start to appear after around a week or two depending on what you're sowing. Remove any weeds as soon as possible and if the seedlings are crammed together pick out a few to provide space for the others to grow. Water well, especially in dry spells. Pinch out the tips of leggy looking plants when they are a few centimetres tall to encourage more stem formation. Most plants will not need staking, though some tall varieties might.

Once the plants start to flower, cut them frequently as this encourages them to produce more buds. Of course, if you don't want to use them as cut flowers the same method can be used to create an annual flower meadow.

Here's a short list of flowers you might like to grow: Nigella, Cornflowers, Larkspur (Consolida), Calendula (Marigolds) Ammi majus (Bishop's flower), Scabious, Gypsophila (Baby's Breath), Godetia, Fennel, Dill, Orlaya grandiflora and the shorter sunflowers.


