


Volunteer Treasurer urgently required.

Did you know that huge numbers of sunflowers were planted around Chernobyl to clear the water and ground of radioactive elements after the nuclear disaster? The sunflowers were successful in absorbing radioactive cesium and strontium, storing them in their stems and leaves. Plants are amazing at their ability to solve some of the problems we human beings create.

Okay.. so, what's this got to do with our gardens? Well, as we get more rainstorms our environment is being affected by the sudden deluges of water. All hard surfaces, being impermeable, such as roofs, patios, pavements and tarmac or concrete driveways channel water rapidly into drains and the sewage system. The problem occurs when the drains can't cope with this sudden influx of water and flooding occurs, sometimes so bad that sewage and other wastes resurface.

So, the quantity of rain is a problem but so is its quality. Rain washes down dust, and toxins created by vehicles as well as bacteria and animal faeces and becomes very polluted. Harsh rainfall also leaches fertilisers and other chemicals out of the soil and into rivers and streams, where they cause algal blooms, depleting the amount of oxygen and sunlight for the plants and animals that live there.

By designing our gardens to slow down the rate at which rain ends up in drains and using plants to clean the water, we can help counter the problems that torrential rain causes. Firstly, we can ensure that our driveways are made of permeable materials so that the rain soaks into the soil. An existing impermeable drive needs to have areas around it that can soak up the water quickly. Areas of gravel will do, but better still are borders planted with vegetation that can tolerate sudden influxes of water.

Rainwater pouring down from roofs can be collected by diverting it from the drainpipes into water butts or other larger containers such as underground tanks.

Stormwater planters are an attractive solution to slowing down the rate of water run-off and acting as filters. These containers should not be watertight and need to be placed by a drainpipe which can empty the rainwater into them. During a heavy downpour the water from the drainpipe will flow into the planter temporarily creating a pool and permeate down through the soil and out through holes or a pipe at ground level into surrounding borders. Stormwater planters need to be at least 30cms deep and filled with plants that can tolerate fluctuating amounts of water around their roots, such as daylilies, asters, astilbes, and shrubs including dogwood, sea buckthorn and blackcurrants. These plants and the soil around them will absorb some of the pollutants brought down by the rain.

Like the use of sunflowers at Chernobyl, we too can employ plants in our gardens to combat problems in our environment which humanity has created.

RHUBARB AND CUSTARD BLONDIES

So I will be completely honest with you all for a moment. When I first heard of this flavour combination I was immediately skeptical and I did have a rather difficult time convincing myself to try it.

This combination has been around for many years now and I think it is safe to say that it is iconic – whether you remember those boiled sweets or even just stewed rhubarb topped with a delicious custard. I wanted to bring you a seasonal recipe again not only because the ingredients are more accessible to everyone, but I think it's a brilliant way to celebrate the British seasonal crops. While a rhubarb and custard blondie might be a new experience for you or even if it isn't, I found that the tangy rhubarb and creamy custard paired perfectly with the sweet, fudgy blondie!

Ingredients: 3 eggs

180g rhubarb 125g plain flour 300g granulated sugar 75g custard powder

2 tbsp water 200g white chocolate chips

200g unsalted butter (melted) 100g custard

Method:

Start by chopping your rhubarb into small pieces. Add it to a pan with the water and 50g of the sugar and place over a medium heat, stirring occasionally until the rhubarb softens. Once the rhubarb has softened, which should take around 5 minutes, set the pan aside for now and let it cool.

Preheat the oven to 180° C /160° C fan and line an 8" square tin with baking parchment. Put your melted butter and remaining sugar in a bowl and beat until smooth. Next, add in the eggs and beat again until they are incorporated into the mixture and then add in the plain flour and custard powder and beat again until combined. Lastly, fold in the white chocolate chips/chunks and pour the mixture into the previously lined tin making sure to spread it out evenly.

Next, I made my custard. However, if you are using premade custard then you can also measure yours out at this point. Dollop the rhubarb mixture from the pan and the custard over the top of the blondie batter and swirl them both through using a knife or a cake skewer.

Bake for about 35 – 40 minutes or until there is a small wobble in the middle. Leave them to cool fully before portioning and serving. If you want your blondies to be denser and fudgier I recommend chilling them in the fridge for a few hours for best results. The quantities of this recipe can of course be doubled or halved depending on how many blondies you want to make. Happy baking!

The patient will then be informed in timely fashion.

The aim is to make the processing of appointment requests more efficient by ensuring that a patient's needs are met in the most appropriate way and by making the best use of the resources we have available.

In the Countryside

Perry Littleboy

This is the greening month, like watching a speeded-up water painting unfolding, faster and faster, our countryside becoming verdant, but with so many different tones and nuances of green. As the year progresses to late summer, most of these shades will turn into a uniform green, but for now it is like a colour sample, with every adjective employed, and some that should not be adjectives. Juniper green, Chartreuse green, Olive green, Sage green, Emerald green, Lime green, Pear green, Basil green, Parakeet green and even Crocodile green and Kelly green!

I learnt the following from a David Attenborough post. Plants rooted in the soil have a small negative charge. The higher up the plant, the greater the electrical charge. This creates an electrical field around the plant, which the bees will pick up on. The bees have a positive charge and, as the bee approaches the flower and lands, the positive and negative fields cancel each other out at the very moment when the negatively-charged pollen will jump across onto the positively-charged bee. The second result is that the flower now has a changed electric field, which the next bee that approaches will detect. The plant is telling the bee that there is no nectar to be had and that the bee should come back later, when the nectar has been refilled. Is that not amazing? Other plants have a more mechanical solution. One reader told me that she had read that when a Hoverfly lands on a Speedwell flower, its weight triggers two ripe stamens to move upwards to brush pollen on to the fly's belly.

The delicate white flowers of Stitchwort is the needlepoint through our hedgerow bottoms, with White dead nettles and above the startlingly white froth of Blackthorn. Even the Forget-me-not's heart turns from yellow to white, when it has been pollinated by a passing bee. According to thehappygardens on Instagram last year, apparently bees sleep between five and eight hours a day, sometimes in flowers, ("where the bees sucks, there sleep I, Under a cowslip bell I lie") and they like to sleep with other bees and hold each other's feet! I bet this is the only image you remember from this entire article.

At the very beginning of the month, listen out for the arrival of the Willow warbler and Blackcap (extraordinarily, I have heard the first Blackcap on 7^{th} April in 2019, 2021, 2022 and 2023 and in 2020, it first sang for me on 8^{th} April!). Whitethroat a week later; our Swallows $14^{th} - 19^{th}$ and the Cuckoo from $23^{rd} - 27^{th}$.

The Pink moon (after the flowering Creeping phlox) or Budding moon, or Awakening moon, or Paschal moon is on 24th April. Unfortunately, this will diminish the impact of the Lyrid meteor shower (22-23 Aprila at its best), first recorded in 687 BC!
