

### **Letter from our Rector**

#### Why is it Christ-mas?

Sociologists have been describing the Western culture of the past few decades as Post-Modern and Post-Christian. These categories mean many things I cannot explain in a brief way. But it also means that today we assume much of the Christian faith in our society when in fact we do not know much about it.

As December begins, I can wish you Happy New Year! I am not jumping ahead to the end of the month. Rather, I am referring to the new liturgical year. The liturgical year is the calendar of the life of the Church which holds major festivities in our society such as Christmas, Easter, Ash Wednesday, or Three Kings Day (very famous in The Netherlands, Belgium, France or Spain).

The liturgical calendar begins with the season of Advent, which comes from Latin and means arrival. This is a season of four weeks in which we prepare ourselves to welcome the arrival of Jesus Christ. Traditionally we celebrate Jesus' birth with a service of Holy Communion (Christ Mass) right when the day becomes 25th December.

Historically speaking, we do not know when Jesus Christ was born. If you come to the services of the Benefice you will soon hear the Christmas story and how unconventional it was. So it is not surprising that we do not know the exact day when someone as important as Jesus was born.

So why do we celebrate it then?

If I had to choose, I would pick a summer day when we can all go to the beach and have some mojitos under a Palm tree to wish happy birthday to Jesus. And this is where the liturgical calendar becomes exciting!

Almost everything we do in church has a meaning. We do things to mean things. Historically speaking, Christmas is celebrated on the last darkest day of the year, coinciding with the winter solstice, and while this natural event changes somewhat, the point of the church is that after the dark comes light. In the Bible Jesus is call the Sun of Righteousness. After the dark, the Sun of Righteousness shines forth, bringing us ever closer to the light of spring and summer. The liturgical year therefore unites science, astronomy in this case, with religion.

In the liturgical year we start with Jesus, and we finish with him because he is the centre of all Christian life. My prayer for this new liturgical year is that we may be able to see the Sun of Righteousness shining greater in our hearts everyday as a community.

Happy Jesus' Birthday!

### In the Kitchen

#### BACON, BRIE AND CRANBERRY SAUSAGE ROLLS

Happy festive season to you all! This Christmas, I thought I would share a savoury festive favourite amongst my family with you. These treats are delicious and indulgent and such an easy way to enjoy some festive flavours. They can be made larger or smaller depending on the occasion and are ideal starters to hand around at any Christmas party, not to mention they would perfectly complement your Christmas dinner. They are a brilliant opportunity to enjoy some family baking as they are super easy to make, so everyone can get involved!

#### Ingredients:

350g Pork Sausage Meat
1 tsp Onion Granules
1 tsp Sage
6 Streaky Bacon Rashers
4 tbsp Cranberry Sauce
100g Brie
500g Ready to roll Puff Pastry
1 Egg



Preheat the oven to 180° and line two baking trays with parchment paper. Next, combine the sausage meat, onion granules, and sage in a bowl and mix well until fully incorporated.

Lightly flour a work surface, remove the pastry from the packaging, and then roll out until the thickness has halved. Cut the pastry down the middle of the long side, then split the cranberry sauce evenly between the two halves and spread thinly leaving a small border along the edge. Split the sausage meat evenly between each, forming a cylinder shape down the middle. Cut the brie into long thin strips and try to push it into the sausage meat as much as possible to avoid it seeping out too much then layer the bacon rashers, cut up to half the width of the pastry, and lay them on top of the sausage meat. If the bacon is along the bottom, you will get a soggy bottom as I found out the hard way!

Whisk an egg and lightly brush the pastry edge with the egg wash. Roll the pastry so that both sides meet at the egg wash and crimp all the edges with a fork. I sliced each roll into 6, however at this point, you can cut more or less depending on the size and preferred number of rolls. The baking time will vary depending on the size of your sausage rolls so please keep an eye on them in the oven.

Brush each roll with egg wash and score each one before baking in the oven for 20 to 25 minutes. Serve with cranberry sauce warm or cold and enjoy. Happy Baking!

Last year's RSPB Christmas cracker gave me the following "joke": When should you buy a bird? When it is going cheep! Well, I hope that has got you into the spirit of Christmas!

2023 was a "Waxwing winter" when many thousands flew in from Scandinavia, rather than the usual few hundred. This unusual migration is called an "irruption" (sic). You will probably see them feeding on Cotoneaster or Rowan berries and may be alerted to their presence by the sound of their trilling call. But they are absolutely and unmistakenly beautiful: somewhere between a sparrow and a blackbird in size, they are "pinky-buff and crested" (how the British Trust for Ornithology puts it) with the crest being the bird's most striking feature. The name, Waxwing, comes from bright red and yellow spots on their wing, whilst in Germany, they are known as "silk tails" for the delicate yellow band spun across their tail feathers. The Latin name for Waxwing is, wonderfully, Bombycilla garrulus, as Bombycilla comes from the Greek, Bombyx, for silk. And Garrulus? Certainly, listening to their call on the Chirp app makes them sound very chatty! And fearless. You can approach them closer than you think you should. I have never, ever seen a Waxwing (top lip trembles). Perhaps this winter will treat me. Last year they were seen in Bassingbourn and they were also observed at one of the car parks at Addenbrooke's hospital.

You may well see a Blackcap on your feeder, unusually for a migrant Warbler. Known as the Northern Nightingale (though silent now), but in Yorkshire as the Coal-Hoodie, their song in Spring is fast and melodious, though with the odd scratchy note thrown in. But the ones we see now are **not** our overwintering Blackcaps, left over from the summer (ours are on a cushy billet in North Africa). These are different birds that arrive in from South and Central Europe and they have evolved a different migration route and will return to their breeding grounds in Spring.

In December and early January, you can walk down to the reedbed below Wimpole Hall, south of A603, at 3.30 in the afternoon and over the next 30 minutes you may see hundreds of starlings murmurating, like watching whisps of black smoke with the film spool reversed. Instead of the smoke being blown apart and dissipating, the wisps are blown together as the birds fly in from the surrounding countryside in tens and twenties, then forming larger and larger clouds, which will settle eventually in the reed bed.

From looking skywards, now cast your gaze downwards. Mosses are at their best in January because of all the moisture in the air. They can hold a huge amount of water and thereby create their own humid microclimate where they grow.

### In the Countryside

Woodlice and slugs like to hide beneath it, and Blackbirds like to scuff it all up in their hunt for food, but moss is also home to microscopic creatures with names straight out of Doctor Who, like rotifers, tardigrades and nematodes.

*Tardigrades* are often referred to either as "Moss Piglets" or "Water Bears" because they look like little bears with eight puffy legs, with little claws, and two eyes, a nose and a mouth! I have learned that tardigrades can live for a hundred years, withstand extreme heat and cold, and you can find them everywhere. They protect themselves by going into a type of hibernation called cryptobiosis. They roll up into a dried little ball, and just stay dormant, with no sign of life until they are wetted. Scientists have rehydrated them from a piece of moss in a museum collection that was a hundred years old. They've been frozen and defrosted, put under pressure, subjected to very high temperatures and survived.

The Christmas calendar used to start with fasting from 1<sup>st</sup> to the 24<sup>th</sup> December, followed by the twelve days of celebrations, feasting and jollity. On the Twelfth Night (5<sup>th</sup> January), you must go a-wassailing. The tradition in the West Country is to sing to your apple trees to bid them good health and scare away the evil spirits, ensuring a productive apple harvest come next autumn. (There is also the housevisiting wassailing where you go door to door, singing and offering a drink from your wassail bowl. This has largely been replaced by carol singers!) The Twelfth Night is also Epiphany Eve, the night before the feast day celebrating the Three Magi's visit to the Christ child. The second Sunday after Epiphany is Plough Sunday, when the plough is blessed in front of the congregation (with prayers for a fruitful crop growing year) and the following Monday is called Plough Monday, which marks the end of the festivities (the plough was dragged from house to house in a pageant, with much singing and drinking... again) and the beginning of the agricultural year... the celebrations are over, so now back to your fields! Plough Sunday (12<sup>th</sup> January) is one book-end to twin with Harvest Festival, thanking God for the fruits of the year's labours (which will be on 6<sup>th</sup> October in 2025).

In midwinter, if you have binoculars, you can see the Great Orion Nebula which sits just below Orion's belt (three stars in a line at an angle). Also the Andromeda Galaxy, a barred spiral galaxy and the nearest large galaxy to the Milky Way (it is twice the size of our Milky Way). It is some 2.5 million light years away but can be seen through binocs if you look at the Andromeda constellation.

The December Full Moon is the Cold Moon and is on  $15^{th}$ , the day after the peak of the Geminid meteor shower (look to the constellation of Gemini), with the Ursid meteor shower at its peak on  $22^{nd}$  December . The January Wolf Moon is on  $13^{th}$ .

NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough is urging anyone eligible for their COVID-19, flu, RSV or pneumococcal vaccines to make sure they've had them this winter. Please check if you, or someone you care for, is eligible - each vaccine has a slightly different eligibility criteria as follows:

- Flu vaccine for anyone aged 65 or over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2025); have certain long-term health conditions; are pregnant; live in a care home; are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance; or live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
- COVID-19 vaccine for anyone aged 65+; those aged between six months and 64 years who are at increased risk of getting seriously ill due to a health condition or treatment; people who live in a care home for older adults, and those who are pregnant; and frontline health and care workers.
- RSV vaccine for anyone who is pregnant, or aged 75-79.
- Pneumococcal vaccine for anyone 65 or over (only one dose is needed).




