Rector's Letter

Shamus Williams

What's Your Name?

Shortly before "lockdown" began, a dear friend from schooldays died of cancer. To me, his name was Christopher, or Chris, though at school he was sometimes called Harry, because of the glasses he wore, and so looked a little like the comedic actor at that time called Harry Worth. Only after Chris died did I discover he was known by some as Stanners. When you conduct funerals as I do, you soon learn that most people either don't use their first given name, or are known by a nickname they acquired in their youth. I have been reading "Dark Salt Clear" by Lamorna Ash, which documents time spent in the Cornish fishing village of Newlyn. The author spends a week on a fishing boat, and it is only when she gets given a nickname that she feels really accepted by the crew. There is a gory desription of gutting rays. They require a stab apparently. She gets the knack, and is nicknamed "Raymundo".

I think Jesus was keen on giving people nicknames. Two brothers he gave the name Boanerges, which means "Sons of Thunder". They were a bit "full on", I imagine. Simon he gave the name Peter, which means "rock". If you know what Peter did when Jesus was arrested, he could not be described as being a rock, and yet that nickname may have been the spur for Peter to be more rocklike later. I suppose it's possible to acquire a nickname that is based on something horrible about a person, and schoolchildren can sometimes give a cruel nickname to some teachers, but I think usually these names are really about affection. If you have a nickname, you may not like it, but maybe you will be helped if you think of it as a term of affection.

At the time of writing (12th June), four of our church buildings Abington Pigotts, Guilden Morden, Litlington and Steeple Morden, are about to be opened for individuals to enter for prayer. We don't know when church services will resume, but very simple funerals only are now permitted, with restricted numbers allowed to attend. In the Garden

High Summer: this area gets little rain, in comparison to other parts of the country. So watering plants is essential in hot weather, unless the garden consists of mainly drought tolerant plants. Vegetables, like pumpkins, courgettes and cucumbers need copious amounts of water supplied at regular intervals and the soil should not be allowed to dry out completely in between watering. An upturned, 2 litre bottle, (recycled plastic ones) attached to a watering spike, stuck into the ground next to each plant is a good way of supplying a continuous source of water. Similarly peppers and aubergines also benefit from a regular waterering to produce well-formed vegetables.

Most plants will be more productive if they are given a high potash feed every week. Liquid seaweed contains many trace elements, such as magnesium, needed by plants in their growth and this can be absorbed through their leaves to produce healthier crops. A diluted solution of it applied every 10 days or so will help, especially in drier conditions.

Powdery mildew often affects plants in late summer. It is a fungus that appears as white powdery patches on leaves, stems and flowers. High air moisture content in conjunction with very dry soil creates perfect conditions for this fungus and it can be discouraged by ensuring that earth around plants remains moist by covering with a mulch of shredded bark or grass clippings and watering well. A humid atmosphere can also be avoided by watering the base of the plants rather than the leaves, especially in the evening.

As our environment continues to change, with drier summers and less rainfall, drought tolerant plants will become an important feature of our gardens out of necessity. Whilst it is difficult to grow vegetables without using lots of water, by choosing the right sorts of ornamental plants it is possible to have a garden which relies mainly on rainfall.

I am in the process of getting rid of the lawn in the front garden as I don't have the time or resources to maintain a perfect lawn. Borders containing drought tolerant shrubs and herbaceous perennials, surrounded by gravel paths, will eventually replace it. The Beth Chatto gardens in Essex is famous for its dry garden and is well worth a visit to see how beautiful this type of planting can look. (https://www.bethchatto.co.uk/gardens/gallery/gravel-garden.htm)

Drought tolerant plants require a well-drained soil which does not become waterlogged in the winter as constant water around their roots will

lead to them rotting. Mixing grit and compost into a heavy soil will help the soil structure and increase drainage. On the other hand, sandy soils will need additional organic matter such as compost and mulches to retain water in the summer. Once the soil has been modified, planting can begin. September is a much better time for this than July and August when there is more chance of rain and it isn't too hot.

So, what to plant? Lavender, rosemary, thymes, ornamental grasses, sedums and rock roses (Cistus) are popular and easy to find, but there are many more choices. The RHS website has a good section on drought resistant plants (https://www.rhs.org.uk/advice/profile?pid=397).

TESTING FOR CORONAVIRUS

If you have suspected coronavirus symptoms you can book either a drivethrough or mail-order test. Visit www.gov.uk/coronavirus and enter your details to book a test, or for anyone who needs additional help, call 119 between 7am and 11pm or 18001 0300 303 2713 if you have hearing or speech difficulties.

You will be sent a booking code. The booking system will only show you details of test locations which are available in the following 24 hours. The coronavirus test centre can help you book a test, answer your enquiries about the testing process and what to do once you have your result, or chase up any delayed results.

Hertfordshire's mobile test sites are all open 10am to 4pm and are as follows:

- on Thursdays in Watford at the Central Watford Leisure Centre, WD17 3HA
- on Saturdays in Hertford at County Hall, Pegs Lane, SG13 8DQ,
- · on Saturdays at Tesco, Shire Park, Welwyn Garden City
- on Sundays in Watford at the Central Watford Leisure Centre, WD17 3HA
- on Mondays in Stevenage, off Six Hills Way, SG1 2DF. Please follow the signs to the test centre to ensure that you do not join a queue for the Household Waste Recycling Centre.

PLEASE TAKE A MOBILE to the test centre.

Tests are effective if people are swabbed in the first three days of having suspected symptoms. The nose and throat swab test cannot detect whether someone has had coronavirus in the past. Symptoms of coronavirus are: a new continuous cough, a high temperature, a loss of or change in a person's sense of taste or smell.

When all available slots have been booked at a particular site, that location will not appear on the national list. Additional capacity is added regularly so check-in on the website throughout the day if you are not successful in booking a local drive-through or mail-order the first time you try.

TRACING If your test is positive you will be contacted by someone from the NHS Test and Trace team and will be told to self-isolate for 14 days. Genuine contact tracers will:

- call you from 0300 013 5000
- send you a text message from "NHS"
- · ask you to sign into the NHS test and Trace website
- ask for your full name and date of birth to confirm your identity, and postcode to offer support while you are self-isolating
- · ask about your coronavirus symptoms
- ask you to provide the name, telephone number and/or email address of anyone you have had close contact with from 2 days before your symptoms started
- ask if anyone you have been in contact with is under 18 or lives outside the UK

Search online for "NHS Test and Trace – how it works" for more information. You will NEVER be asked to disclose bank details or ring an expensive phone number beginning with 09 or 087 by a genuine Test and Trace team member.


