In The Garden

It's still bulb planting time! No, I've not gone completely mad – I'm talking about summer flowering bulbs, rhizomes and tubers such as gladioli, eucomis, nerines, lilies, crocosmias, cannas and even dahlias. The planting season for these starts in February indoors, later outdoors, and goes through to the end of May.

You might be thinking, why bother with these bulbs? Well, the summer flowering ones are rather flamboyant and can create a very exotic looking border if you plant them with big leaved plants like fatsia and bananas. They also extend the flowering season well into autumn.

Let's start with something familiar; crocosmias, or montbretias as they used to be called. There's the well-known red flowered variety called 'Lucifer'. It has arching sprays of tubular flowers and long sword-shaped bright green leaves. But not all of us are tempted by something so 'loud'. Try 'Emily Mackenzie' which has orange flowers with blotches of red in a ring around the petals. 'George Davison' is smaller and a gentle shade of orange to vellow whilst Crocosmia pottsii 'Culzean Pink' is not really pink but more a peachy colour. All these varieties thrive in a sunny position in soil that is moist but well-drained and flower from July to September. To create an exotic looking border, try putting together cannas, eucomis, lilies, and gladioli. Some cannas are much hardier than others; we grow a dark purple-brown leaved variety with orange flowers and leave it in the border right through winter. It starts to emerge in April and will flower from August onwards right through to when the frost turns the plant to mush. We then cover it with wood mulch and let it overwinter in situ. Cannas will reach 2 metres or more in the right conditions. The leaf colour varies from plain mid green, striped green and yellow, multicoloured orange, pink, purple and green stripes right through to the deepest brown. They can have cream, yellow, pink, peach, orange or red flowers. They prefer a sheltered position where their leaves will not get torn by strong winds and require the same growing conditions as crocosmias.

Eucomis, also known as the pineapple lily is fairly easy to grow and is somewhat tender. Grow them in front of cannas, where they can enjoy a lot of sun. Their strappy leaves and cylindrical arrangement of flowers on a stout stem provide a nice contrast. Flowers are usually purple or white. They will need lifting in winter if you want to ensure their survival and stored in a frost free place.

I have never been a great fan of the hybridised gladioli so often seen at flower shows. However, there are some beautiful more delicate varieties. Gladiolus byzantinus has bright pink small lily like flowers arranged along mid green stems. G. murielae (also known as Acidanthera murielae) have nodding white flowers with a maroon base on long stems. I hope I've given you some ideas for enhancing the flower borders this summer.

In the Kitchen

SALMON TERIYAKI STIR FRY

This is a beautiful time of year and there is nothing more glorious than the seasonal flowers and the new birth that Spring brings with it. However, this time of year can be quite confusing when it comes to deciding what to bake or cook. It's hard to separate the warm winter comfort favourites that we all know and love from the seasonal Summer salads and barbecues that are fast approaching. The lovely thing about this recipe is that it is warm and comforting whilst being light and healthy. Stir-frys are hugely adaptable and can be a great way to use as many different vegetables as you want, so feel free to adapt it to make it your own.

(SALMON)

- 4 salmon fillets
 4 sheets of foil
 2 tbsp mirin
 2 tbsp honey
 2 tbsp sweet chilli jam
 4 tbsp soy sauce
 3 tsp ginger puree
 1 tsp garlic puree
- 2 tsp sesame oil

(STIR FRY)

250g Pak choi (2 large Pak choi) 100g mange tout 100g baby corn 3 garlic cloves (grated) 100ml fish stock/vegetable stock 1 tbsp sesame oil 1 tbsp vegetable oil 250g noodles of choice (I use dry, egg noodles)

METHOD:

Begin by preheating the oven to 200C / 180C fan alternatively if you have an Air Fryer set it to 200C for 14 minutes on the air fry setting.

Combine all the ingredients for the salmon marinade in a small bowl and mix well. Take each salmon fillet and place it in the middle of a sheet of foil and carefully turn up the sides of the foil to make a box around the fillet. Before you spoon out a couple of tablespoons of the marinade onto each salmon fillet, keep some aside to add to the noodles later. Carefully scrunch the top of the foil over making sure there are no holes or rips and if using the oven, place the fillets on a baking tray and cook for 20 to 30 minutes. If you are using an air fryer, place the fillets in the air fryer and start it as you usually would. Chop your vegetables. Heat the sesame and vegetable oil in a wok and add the grated garlic cloves, stir-frying for a few minutes to soften. Add the vegetables and stir fry until the leaves start to wilt and soften. Add in the fish/vegetable stock and the noodles and cover for a few minutes, you want the pak choi stems to be tender but still have a bit of a bite. Dish up the stir-fry and place the salmon fillets on top of the noodles, please take care when removing them from the foils as it will all be very hot. When adding the salmon at the end I like to pour the leftover sauce from the foil on top of the stir-fry noodles and salmon dishes for some extra flavour.

In the Countryside

The poet, Emily Dickinson, said, "I hope you love birds too. It is economical. It saves going to heaven." Well, I am not sure she is right, but certainly May is the "heaven-on-earth" month, with bird song at its peak and flowers galore.

Gerard Manley Hopkins coined the neologism, "shivelights" which describes the sharp lances of sunshine through trees. Certainly, walking under the Horse chestnuts and Lime trees on a sunny day sends shivelights over your clothes and skin.

In may, the Dog daisies will be in full flower and by the end of May, the Dog roses will be too. "When Lupins flower, the bees will swarm," is an old country saying - the plant's name derives from the Latin for wolf, as the flower has a wolf-like fang.

Half the world's Bluebells apparently grow in Britain. I did not know that fairies trap passers-by in Bluebells flowers, so be warned. It's also said that if you wear the flowers as a garland, you are compelled to speak the truth. Pages on book spines and feather fletching on arrows were glued by the sticky sap from mashed bluebells,

Lords and ladies, or Cuckoo pint or Friar's cowl (Arum maculatum) come in to flower this month. The erect purple spike is revealed as the leaf opens, and this smells of rotting meat. The stench attracts Owl midges (also called the Moth fly) which fall through the hairs into a "kettle" where the true male and female flowers are. Eventually the bristles will wither and the midge can then fly out carrying pollen to the next flower. Later in the year, the pollinated flower will become bright red berries on a stalk, poisonous to us but apparently not to pheasants.

Also this month and next, you may see Caterpillar cobwebs all over a Hawthorn or Blackthorn hedgerow. They are very obvious, with all the leaves completely eaten up. This is the work of the Ermine moth caterpillar.

The 12th May is Beltane, the Gaelic May Day festival, marking the beginning of summer (about midway between the Spring and Summer Equinox). One would hang Birch and mountain ash over your door to keep out the "old witch". Presumably young witches are welcome. One might also leave food by any "fairy tree" as an offering to ward off the fairies and prevent them from stealing your milk.

On 29th May, it is Oak Apple Day or Royal Oak Day or Shickshack Day. John Lewis-Stempel in *The Wood* writes that the day was celebrated to mark the formal restoration of King Charles II and also in memory of the Oak tree in Boscobel in which he hid after the battle of Worcester in 1651 (hence the ubiquitous pub name "The Royal Oak".) Children would wear oak leaves and oak apples in their lapels and if not, they could be kicked and punched and thrashed with nettles. Over time, Shickshack Day became a day of licentiousness, this being the countryside and all!

May's full moon (the Flower moon) is on 23rd May.

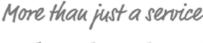


