### Letter from our Rector

#### Autumn is for cozy and warm

Well, here we begin our journey together. I am so very honoured to be your rector. I am deeply enjoying getting to know you all and the wonderful land that surrounds our villages.

I was very motivated by how many of you came to the service of my institution and installation on 2<sup>nd</sup> October. Together we were able to welcome friends and neighbour from around the county. In fact, we even had Roman Catholics, Methodists, and our wonderful Congregationalist brothers and sisters coming to rejoice with us. The welcome that I received then will keep me warm all these coming cold months. I for one am enjoying autumn and look forward to saying hello to winter. This season is in my mind a season of preparation for excitement and party: it is in this season when we normally start the liturgical new year, that is, the beginning of all the festivities and seasons in the life of the Church of which, Christmas and Easter are two major events. It is also a season of trying to stay at home with a blanket, a book and in my case, eating some roasted chestnuts, my favourite snack of the season.

The days are very much darkening step by step and it seems to me they are a reflection of what is going on around the world with wars and tragedies everywhere. That is perhaps why in the liturgical calendar we remember All Saints and All Souls in this month of November: All Saints is our feast because we are all called to be holy, that is, to be more fully human, to be spotless.

On Remembrance Day we honour those who showed sacrificial love by dying on the battlefield to ensure our freedom. But also, we hold close in our hearts those who are currently risking their life trying to make a better world in areas of conflict. My daughter's Godfather, an army captain, is one of those brave persons.

In our fields, not that I am an expert on it, there is still much work to be done. I am amazed at how much farmers do, even outside of growing season. I continue praying for them regularly in my prayers. Farmers show hope in tangible ways; many things are out of their control in their business, and they hope for the best. That is what we look forward to during this time: holiness, expectation, and going deeper in the dark so the light may shine brighter.

### In The Garden

The bare root planting season has started! And you might well ask what on earth is she talking about? Many years ago, before the commercialisation of selling plants in pots, November heralded the beginning of planting time. At this point, trees and shrubs with their roots and soil made into a ball tied up in hessian would become available to the gardener ready for use. The reason that one can do this without stressing out the plants, is that at this time of year they will have shed their leaves and are in a dormant state. I should add that this only applies to deciduous trees and shrubs; evergreens are best added to the garden in spring or early autumn.

Containerisation does mean that we can plant all year round. However, bare root planting has certain advantages. Firstly, the plants are easier to transport and are less expensive. Secondly, many of them grow away more strongly and quickly than pot grown ones, possibly because the roots are free to expand out into the soil quickly rather than continuing to spiral around the circular pots.

Thirdly, the soil is still warm from being heated by the late summer sun and plants are transporting the sugars from their leaves down to their roots giving them the energy to grow vigorously.

Fourthly, because this is the wetter, colder season, there is not the same need to water the new arrivals. An initial drenching at planting time, and perhaps during very dry winter spells, is all that is needed.

So, now is the perfect time to establish fruit trees and bushes. Bare root raspberry canes, currant and gooseberry bushes can all be planted now. You might like to consider growing apples and pears, or perhaps train a peach or apricot against a warm south or west facing wall.

I always plant bare root roses rather than containerised ones. Much cheaper, for a start! They do benefit from mycorrhizal fungi being added to the soil around the roots. Some are available to make into a gel which sticks to the roots, enabling the symbiotic relationship to start quickly. Otherwise, it's fine to just sprinkle the stuff over the roots during planting.

Apart from growing bare root items, November is an opportune time to start off garlics and Japanese onions that are hardy enough to withstand the winter cold. These both do well in free draining soil rich in organic matter, that does not get waterlogged.

Sweet peas can also be sown in pots now to allow them to produce a good root system over winter, which usually creates a more vigorous plant next year, more floriferous than those sown in spring.

### In the Kitchen

#### CINNAMON BUNS WITH CREAM CHEESE FROSTING

These rolls are perfectly soft and indulgent and a lovely way to enjoy those cold Autumn days. Best enjoyed sitting by the fire with a nice cup of tea or a warm hot chocolate to accompany them, they are bursting with flavour and are so adaptable that they can easily be tweaked to fit your personal preference.

#### Ingredients

Dough:	Cinnamon butter filling:
250ml warm milk	100g unsalted butter (room temperature)
60g granulated sugar	120g brown sugar
7g instant yeast	2 tbsp ground cinnamon
560g plain flour	Cream cheese icing:
75g light brown sugar	120g cream cheese (room temperature)
110g unsalted butter	50g unsalted butter (room temperature)
1 large egg	250g icing sugar
2 tsp vanilla extract	1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 tsp salt	Pinch of salt (optional)
1 teaspoon cinnamon	

For the dough, combine the warm milk, granulated sugar, and instant yeast by gently mixing and leaving to foam for 5 minutes. Once foamy, add the rest of the ingredients and mix until the mixture comes together. IContinue to knead the dough until springy, this will probably take around 10 minutes but keep checking. Transfer the dough to a lightly oiled bowl and leave to rise in a warm place until it has doubled in size, about 2 to 2½ hours.

Next, beat your butter on its own for about 5 minutes to loosen it a little, then add in the brown sugar and cinnamon and continue to beat them together until easily spreadable. Turn the dough onto a floured work surface and roll it into a rectangle roughly 12 by 24 inches. Spread the cinnamon sugar butter onto the dough in an even layer across but leave about half an inch border down one of the long sides of the dough. Starting at the long end opposite the unbuttered side roll up the dough into a tight log. Cut the log into 12 equal pieces with a sharp knife. Place each roll into a lightly buttered baking dish and loosely cover in a warm place until doubled in size.

Preheat the oven to 180 ° and uncover the cinnamon buns to bake for 20-25 minutes or until lightly browned on top. Leave to cool on a wire rack while you make the cream cheese frosting. To make this combine the butter, cream cheese, vanilla, and salt in a mixing bowl and beat until smooth and pale. Sift in the icing sugar and beat again to combine. Once the rolls have cooled a little, spread the cream cheese glaze on top and enjoy.

It is worth phoning and applying, even if you don't think you'll get much, as you'll be able to get other money and help like the Winter Fuel Payment.

### In the Countryside

### Perry Littleboy

A "glimmer" was a term coined by a clinical social worker, Deb Dana, in 2022, and it is the opposite to a "trigger". A trigger, we now know, is a cue, accurate or not, that pushes your mind and body into a flight or fight or freeze state, through a recollection of something in your past that has been traumatic. However, a glimmer, also a cue, but one that moves the body and mind into a feeling of joy or safety, such as seeing a picture of your pet or the sound of a bird call you remember from your childhood. Having learnt this, I find that the more I look for them, the more glimmers I encounter, from a perfect cup of morning coffee, a complete stranger's smile, a grandchild's giggles, to the smell of honey and the weight of a chicken's egg in your hand or rubbing a fresh conker with the ball of your thumb. May you find many glimmers this month.

I am not sure why, but the Sparrowhawk seems very active and visible at this time of year. They seem braver and less concerned at being observed. Blackbird migrants are in the Hawthorn eating the plentiful berries and they, and Robins, made up most of the Sparrowhawk kills in my garden last November. More often I see the male, or "tiercel", which is smaller than the "formel", the female. He has a slate grey back and chestnut barring on his underside. But then I found a Woodpigeon, half-plucked, at the bottom of the garden and can only assume it was the heavier female that brought it down, as I doubt a male is big enough to slay a Woodpigeon. The remains were polished off by the Buzzard, which I disturbed at dawn one morning.

Our foraging garden birds will be feasting on the Cotoneaster berries and Michaelmas daisy seeds. And the seeds of Wild clematis (old man's beard) and Buddleia are especially prized by tits and Bullfinches. They will eat almost any "weed" seed, like Burdock, Sage and Plantains, so don't be tempted to "put to bed" your flower borders or cut back the wild patches of your garden too early. A low sun, after a "dew fall" and the magic of cobwebs amongst the sere vegetation of your winter garden can make for a breathtaking glimmer.

Last year, after ground frosts on 31st October, we had a very mild first half of November, before heavy rains on 14th and then the weather turned cold. Our first frosts will make our root vegetables taste the sweeter. And that first heavy frost will be followed by an almost still day, and all our walnut leaves will fall in silence within hours. It is a spectacular sight, almost eerie. And if you pick up a handful of leaves and crush them between your fingers, they smell of furniture polish. If the English elm (Ulmus procera: "procera" for eminent or high) is the King of trees, the English walnut (Juglans regia) is surely the Queen, with its beautiful rivulets of bark, and its scented, composite leaves, which can be seeped in hot water for a tea that promotes a healthy gut. 18
