## Letter from our village churches

While Jesus was in one of the towns, a man came along who was covered with leprosy. When he saw Jesus, he fell with his face to the ground and begged him, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" And immediately the leprosy left him. (Luke 5:12-13)

**The Leprosy Mission** works in Africa and Asia to diagnose, treat, care for, and advocate for people affected by leprosy, a bacterial disease spread by droplets from the nose or mouth and not by touch. It is rampant in 120 countries with about 200,000 new cases a year.

Have you ever heard of Alice and Wellesley Bailey? Probably not, but 150 years ago they founded a society which has helped millions of people, most of whom live in extreme poverty. For most of the existence of the Leprosy Mission, there was no cure for the condition. Medically there was very little that could be done for sufferers who were often ostracised from their families and their villages. The mission could only offer love, care and acceptance.

Praise God a cure was discovered 40 years ago, but sufferers have to be found in the early stages of the disease before damage has been done and those who live in remote villages are often missed. When diagnosed, they have to walk for miles to make their way to the leprosy hospital. We should count ourselves very lucky that we do not have leprosy, and should pray that it never becomes widespread here.

The last indigenous case of leprosy in the UK died in 1798. Since 2015 there have been an average of 5 new cases each year among people entering the UK from countries in which it is prevalent. Even in the USA, there are 100 cases each year. Try this experiment: fold your hands into fists. Now try to pick something up, try to eat, or brush your teeth. It can't be done. This is what leprosy does to hands and feet because the nerves are damaged. Because there is a lack of sensation, injuries such as cuts can often go unnoticed. Infection will enter and damage the limb and amputation may be required. You will probably face reconstructive surgery for your fingers and hands.

That was not a good prospect for Rajisha in India, a very bright girl just finishing school exams. She had to walk about 60 miles alone because her mother was unwell and her father had to keep working in order to feed the family. Once at the Leprosy Mission, Rajisha had reconstructive surgery on her hands with drugs paid for by the World Health Organisation. She awaits surgery on her other hand. She wants to be a nurse. Why not pray for her and all the other sufferers and pray that leprosy never spreads in this country.



## In The Garden

**September is a great time for making a flower meadow.** Hardy annuals can be sown now to produce a beautiful early summer display of flowers which are useful for cutting, and some are suitable for drying or pressing and making into pictures. Edible flowers and leaves can be added to salads, but be careful to avoid the poisonous ones! This month is good for germinating seeds because there should be more rainfall and the soil is still warm from the summer.

You don't need a big area; a large container will work if space is limited. The main thing is to make sure the plot gets sunshine for more than 4 hours a day otherwise the plants won't grow and flower well. The soil should be free from weeds, dug lightly and raked to produce a fine-grained surface which the seedlings can easily push through.

Mix all the seeds you want to sow together in a small bowl with some dry sand to make it easier to scatter the seeds thinly over the prepared area or container. Once sown, I press the seeds into the soil with the flat end of a rake or by gently stamping over the area using my feet. Water after sowing, ideally using a very fine spray head on the watering can so that the seeds don't get washed into clusters leaving gaps. Seedlings start to appear after about 7 - 10 days depending on the temperature. If we have a dry September, then the area will need watering every couple of days until the seedlings are a few centimetres high.

The varieties of annuals to sow need to be hardy in order to survive the winter; you can buy a hardy annual mixture from various seed companies or make your own. I use the following list of plants:

*Calendula officinalis* (pot marigolds). You don't have to stick to the single bright orange ones – 'Snow Princess' is a creamy white with a dark centre. Then there's 'Sherbet Fizz' with lovely pale apricot petals whose undersides are a sort of rich brown colour. The petals are edible.

*Eschscholzia californica,* (Californian poppy) These dainty plants have blue green filigree foliage and their crinkled flowers are usually orange and red, but a more appealing range include blush pinks, cream and apricot.

Ammi visnaga, (Queen Anne's Lace) – a bit like cow parsley but not invasive. This plant will give height to the area. It's great for cutting and pressing too.

*Consolida regalis* (Annual delphinium – larkspur). Loose spires of flowers in purple, lilac, pink and white are around 75cms tall and are wonderful for cutting.

*Clarkia amoena,* (Godetia). Open, cup shaped, delicate flowers on slender stems and lance shaped leaves. Quite a wide range of colours and heights vary from 30 to 90 cms.

## DELICIOUS APPLE CHEESECAKE CRUMB CAKE

I thought I would share an autumnal classic with you all to celebrate the beginning of my favourite season. Whilst this recipe may look slightly daunting, it is a very easy bake! This recipe is made entirely without eggs and can also be made with dairy-free ingredients for a vegan cake.

### Ingredients

Crumble topping: 125g plain flour 150g granulated sugar 80g butter 1 tsp ground cinnamon 1 tsp vanilla extract Pinch of sea salt Cream cheese filling: 250g cream cheese 1 tbsp brown sugar

1 tbsp corn flour

Apple filling:

2 large baking apples 1 tbsp ground cinnamon Vanilla cake layer: 250g granulated sugar 120g melted butter 170g plain yogurt 2 tsp vanilla extract 1½ tsp baking powder 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda 150g buttermilk 375g plain flour

Preheat your oven to 180°C, grease a 10-inch round cake pan with butter, and line the base with parchment paper.

To make the cinnamon crumble topping combine all of the ingredients in a large mixing bowl and rub together until the mixture resembles bread crumbs and no lumps of butter remain. Set the crumble mixture aside for now and in another medium bowl, toss the chopped apples and sugar together.

To make the cream cheese filling, whisk the cream cheese, brown sugar, and cornflour until smooth and fluffy. Set this aside with the other mixtures.

To make the cake batter, begin by melting your butter in a saucepan over low heat. Once the melted butter has cooled a little whisk in the sugar, yogurt, and vanilla until combined.

In a stand mixer whisk together the dry ingredients, salt, baking powder, and bicarbonate of soda. Once the dry ingredients have been evenly distributed pour in the butter mixture and whisk again to combine. At this point, the cake batter may look very wet try not to panic as the flour will resolve this! Next, add in the flour and the buttermilk and whisk again until fully incorporated.

To assemble the cake, pour half of the cake batter into the cake pan and spread out evenly to the edges, try to keep the top as level as possible so that you get a nice, even bake. Spoon all the cream cheese mixture onto the cake (continued overleaf) *www.shingaychurches.co.uk* 9

batter and once again spread it to the edge of the pan with a spatula, followed by the rest of the cake batter repeating the process.

On top of the second layer of cake batter add the apple mixture and finally sprinkle the crumble topping evenly over the apples.

This recipe requires a long baking time, but I promise you it is worth it, it needs about 70/80 minutes in the oven however I would recommend checking it anytime after around 50 minutes.

A general rule I tend to follow is as soon as I can smell the cake baking in the oven, I will check on its progress by slightly opening the door and inserting a skewer into the centre. If there is no wet cake batter on the skewer then the cake is ready, it will not come out completely clean though as there is a wet cream cheese mixture in the layers. Once out of the oven leave to cool slightly and then dig in! This cake is so delicious it can be enjoyed warm with custard, cream, ice cream, or simply by itself as it is perfect alone. Happy Baking!



# In the Countryside

# Perry Littleboy

This month, the farmers are busy preparing the seedbeds for sowing next year's winter wheat and barley against the clock of wetter autumns. The grain harvest was pretty well in the sheds by the end August and yet the Harvest moon (September 17<sup>th</sup> and a Super moon this year) is the full moon closest to the Autumn Equinox (22<sup>nd</sup> September) and Michaelmas Day, on 29<sup>th</sup> September, was when harvest should have finished fifty years ago. Our seasons and the farming calendar have shifted some 4 or more weeks earlier. Michaelmas Day is the feast day of St Michael, the Archangel who wrestled with Satan. You would roast a goose which had been fed on the grain left to lie in the field after the corn had been cut.

In our gardens, the walnuts start to fall (if the Squirrels and Crows don't harvest them first) and the apples ripen. Every Bramley apple (the UK's most popular cooking apple) comes from a tree that originated from grafts of a single parent tree in Southwell, Nottinghamshire, now 200 years old. Apples are extremely heterozygous, meaning every pip will grow into a different tree with unique characteristics and fruit. The Victorians loved them and made hundreds of cultivars, many of which are now lost. Apple orchards have declined by 56% since 1900, as many orchards were on the outskirts of towns and cities which have since expanded massively.

Our two most common Ladybird species are the 7-spotted (seven black spots on red wing cases) and the invasive, Harlequin (many different hues and markings, but as well as the white "cheeks", it has a distinctive white triangle on the very top of its head). Despite their seemingly ungainly flight, Ladybirds have been recorded flying at 37 mph which is as fast as a horse can gallop. They have also been recorded travelling as far as 74 miles in a single flight (I have puzzled over how this could possibly be measured!). They reach altitudes of 3,600 ft in order to catch a following wind to disperse to new feeding grounds rich in aphids.

The Gatekeeper butterfly is still flying in September. One of our last butterflies to emerge, it looks like a Meadow Brown but is smaller and more orangey. In fact, it is also called the Hedge Brown and likes bramble flowers and Ragwort flowers and flutters around tall vegetation that borders field gates and hedges. You can also see the Common Carder bee, with fur the colour of honey. This bee has two generations each year and the nest persists well into October/November. These nests are often targeted by a brood parasite: the Field cuckoo bumblebee, which do not collect pollen for their offspring (and so have no pollen baskets or, indeed, a worker caste) but instead it lays its eggs in the Common carder's nest.

The Yellow-legged Asian Hornet is an invasive species from Asia and first arrived in Europe in 2004 and, since 2016 (Tetbury, Gloucester), the UK. Asian hornets are principally predators of insects, particularly pollinating insects, including honey

bees. The fear is that hornet populations will have a serious impact on our insect diversity. The **Asian hornet** can be distinguished easily from our native hornet — it has a black abdomen with only a few bars of yellow/orange at the (dangerous) end of the body. The extremities of the legs are yellow and it has an orange face. By contrast, our **European hornet** resembles a large wasp, with a yellow and black stripes and a brown thorax. The face is yellow and brown and it is larger than the Aisan hornets.

All suspected sightings of the Asian hornet should be reported. Photos or video and location should be emailed to *alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk* or you can download an app on to your smartphone "Asian Hornet Watch" which has a GPS in the app which will send the location of your suspected sighting.


