Letter from our village churches

"He who moves not forward, goes backward." (J W von Goethe)

Change. We so often resist it. Sometimes passively, just hoping that by doing nothing, the call for change will disappear. Sometimes actively, by pushing against it, fighting all that compels us to be different.

Yet often, a different approach can have beneficial consequences.

When the Pandemic struck in 2020, we were all forced to stop, think, and change how we did things. For many of us, it gave us a chance to re-evaluate our priorities. For example, being kept away from family and friends helped us to realise just how truly important these relationships are.

Sadly, many watched life being prematurely snatched away from loved ones and strangers, alike. These devastating loses highlighted the frailty of life and brought about a realisation that life is for living. And some of us even learned new skills which have enhanced our lives going forward.

In the Christian calendar there are times when we are called to reflect on transformational change: Lent is one of these times. Lent is the 6-week period leading up to Easter, beginning on Ash Wednesday. It is a time to slow down, to contemplate and to examine ourselves as Christians and disciples for Jesus.

This, of course, is a life-long process that continues until our last breath, but Lent provides us with a regular opportunity to grow and deepen our spirituality by engaging in the regular discipline of prayer and study, and deep reflection.

In a similar way, when a church is "in vacancy" (when there is no Lead Vicar or Rector in a parish), this is a time for the church to reflect and examine its role in the community in which it inhabits; to consider how it might do things differently in future. This is where we, in the Shingay Group of Churches, currently find ourselves. Now is the time for all of us in the villages to consider what kind of church, what kind of ministry, we aspire to have in the future. When these questions have been answered, we will then have a better idea about the kind of Rector we need to help us to get there.

In The Garden

Yasmeen's a bit busy this week so she's handed over to the undergardener again. Apologies.

Those of you who've been enjoying my contributions to this gardening column will know that I'm keen on high returns for little effort. With that in mind, this time of year is dominated by the emergence of Spring bulbs and so I'll share my thoughts about them.

I love bulbs; if you go out into our garden at Christmas, there's nothing going on. But a week later, at New Year, you can be sure to find the first signs of daffodils and snow drops pushing up through the frozen ground, bringing the promise of longer days and warmer weather in the months ahead.

Spring bulbs are really good value in the garden. By their nature, they spread and produce more plants without us having to do anything. Plant a dozen daffodils this year and they'll soon multiply exponentially to give a really good display in just a few years. I've found that the best place to put them is under the leaf canopy of trees which are bare now but which will become much more dense later in the year and thus unsuitable places for many other plants.

You can leave the daffodils there to die down after flowering so that the nutrients from the leaves are returned to the new bulbs forming underground and ready to appear the following year. How you choose to spread them, once they are dormant, is down to your patience and strength. If you're in a hurry, it's perfectly effective to use a spade to turn over a short trench of turf, disturb the soil underneath and place the bulbs about four inches deep before replacing the grass. But that can result in a rather formal arrangement with the bulbs in a row and if you're feeling more creative, perhaps buy a bulb planter (a sort of round spade which you can push into the ground to dig a single hole) and plant the bulbs in a pleasing pattern. Because some daffodils come up earlier than others, you can organise them to flower from the beginning of February right through to April.

Snow drops also seem to do very well around here; a few planted years ago have now become generous drifts across the flower beds. When they get too numerous and tightly grouped together, it's time to split them up. Snow drops don't transplant well as bulbs (they're small and dry out too easily), so you plant them 'in the green'. That means digging them out when they have leaves, splitting up the bunch and transplanting small groups of the entire plants. They will look

rather sad and wilted for a while, but invariably come up in their new position the following year.

But the queen of Spring bulbs are the tulips; bright and spectacular, in a wide range of colour. They're less resilient than the ubiquitous daffodils; a spell of hot weather or extreme cold and wet weather will make their displays less impressive, and they don't generally do as well if left in the ground year after year.

But a couple of dozen new tulip bulbs put at least six inches deep in a large pot of compost in the Autumn (it takes ten minutes, if that) will, with no effort or attention, reward you with a magnificent burst of colour the following April. Easy.

A message from Rev Ann Bol:

You will note that the pattern of services has changed

The number of services on offer each Sunday is reducing, for at least a 4-month trial period. Parishes have been "paired" with adjacent parishes to minimise distances to travel: Abington Pigotts with Litlington; Steeple Morden with Wendy; Guilden Morden already "rotates" with the Congregational Chapel. Each pairing will have a Communion and Family Service every month, and there will be at least two Group Services each month. The rotation of the services will be strictly adhered to, and identical for each church. These changes have been made because:

- the Archdeacon and Rural Dean feel that without a larger team, our current service pattern is unsustainable, and the number of services we have each week will discourage future applicants to the role of rector; and
- the availability of our ministry team is reducing moving forward.






